# **City Administrators Report**

Aug 8-21, 2025

#### Oak Park Estates

I met with Jason, the developer of Oak Park Estates, to discuss his Tax Increment Financing (TIF) agreement and the phased approach he plans to take for the project. Jason expressed his desire to continue building additional homes in the development.

He noted that the majority of homes already built in Oak Park Estates have been purchased by individuals and families relocating from other towns and even out of state. This trend highlights that Nevada is attracting new residents from a variety of areas, which is an exciting sign of growth for the community.

#### Mix-n-Mingle

The Mix-n-Mingle event was a success overall. While attendance was lower than anticipated, the gathering still drew a small but engaged group, creating a positive and welcoming atmosphere.

#### **SRF**

Several State Revolving Fund (SRF) project meetings were canceled recently due to inclement weather, but are scheduled to resume next week. However, one meeting was held last week to address utility line conflicts related to the new project. It was determined that certain active utility lines are located within the project area and must be relocated. An onsite meeting was conducted with staff and contractors to develop a coordinated plan for moving these utilities while ensuring uninterrupted service to current users.

#### RFP

We have received inquiries from several contractors regarding the Requests for Proposals (RFPs) currently issued for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Façade Program, indicating growing interest in the project. The proposals are due in September, and we anticipate receiving a strong pool of submissions from which to select qualified contractors.

#### West 18th Street Storm Sewer Line - Investigation Summary & Next Steps

We have been in communication with both OnTrack and the associated pipeline companies regarding the utility line assessment. OnTrack completed probing to a depth of six feet but did not locate any pipelines. As a next step, they will dig **potholes** to more accurately determine the depth and location of the existing lines. Ideally, these pipelines are at least eight feet deep, which would prevent conflicts during the planned line replacement. Completion of this work is expected to address the flooding concerns along West 18th Street.

#### **Substantial Completion WBCI**

Williams Brothers have been actively working on completing the items outlined in the punch list issued following the award of substantial completion for the project. These remaining tasks are generally minor in nature, addressing final details, adjustments, and quality checks identified during the inspection process. Based on current progress, Williams Brothers is expected to complete all outstanding items in a timely manner, allowing the project to move toward final acceptance without significant delays.

#### I & I

The dates for the upcoming Inflow and Infiltration (I&I) Program inspections have been scheduled. These inspections will take place at the end of September and continue into October. Information regarding the program has already been shared with the public and will continue to be promoted across

all of the City's communication platforms, including the website, social media, and community notices. The goal is to ensure that residents are fully informed and prepared for the inspection process.

#### MY REPORT

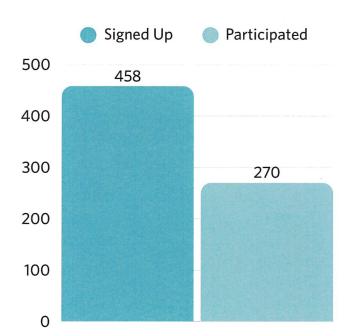

I have attached a summary from Dylan Davison, Youth Services Librarian, of our 2025 Summer Reading Program participation.

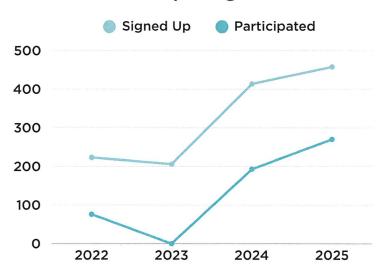
# Summer Reading Wrap Up

## 2025 Totals



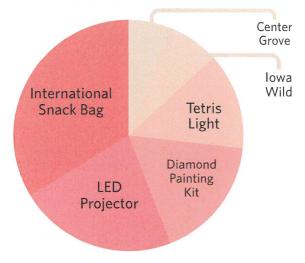

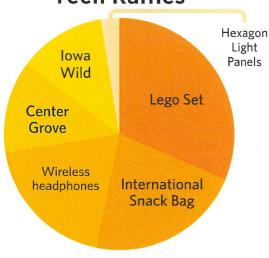

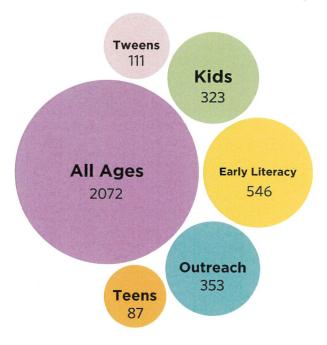
